May 11, 2020 Executive Leadership Committee Meeting Summary

TUESDAY, MAY 11, AT 6:30PM

A number of things happened at this meeting. The highlights are:

• Monthly Club Treasurer's Report (see below).

- A financial spreadsheet has been created, giving us the capability to track all expenditures and revenue, going back to 2017. This will be used in the Strategic Planning Meeting held each November.
- The meeting scheduled for May 26th was canceled; Ken B. reported on the changes that will be made at the June meeting if it isn't canceled. This is dependent on the CSPD's decision as it is their meeting room.
- Ken B. provided an update on the 2020 Colorado Springs Coin, Currency, and Collectibles show. It's still "on" but the El Paso County Department of Health has the final say. There will be no auction.
- Newsletter: There will *not* be a Show Special edition of the newsletter. There will be a contest to give the newsletter a name. We will also be selling advertising.
- ANA news regarding the coronavirus was discussed. In particular, the ANA Summer Seminar sessions have been canceled.
- There will be year-end prizes for those who help with club events and activities. This specifically excludes elected officers performing their appointed duties, though they can qualify by performing additional work.
- Membership report: The club has 84 members, 31 of whom have not yet paid their 2020 dues. Two dues payments were received, one of them from a new member! Two members are honorary members because of how much they do on a continuing basis for the Club.

Ads will cover that fraction of the text area, for example a quarter page ad will be half of one column on a two column page, or the bottom quarter of the text area, excluding header, footer and margins. Ads must be print-ready. They can be changed from issue to issue, by providing an updated print-ready ad at least ten days before the next club meeting.

2020 COLORADO SPRINGS COINS, CURRENCY AND COLLECTIBLES SHOW UPDATE

The show is still ON as of this writing. However the Health Department could cancel it at any time. In the meantime Ken B. and the Club are looking for volunteers.

We do not have to staff the front table. So that leaves us setup, teardown, and manning the club tables.

Here is the volunteer schedule:

- 0830-1700 Table setup. (Ken B. Team Lead) Six to Seven needed. Work gloves strongly encouraged.
- 0830-1200 Lamp checks and repair. Hopefully same team as last time (JC S., Terry C., Dave J.).
- 1200-1700 Electrical 2-3 people to put down electrical cords.
- 1400-1700 Cover tables (Lynn M. Team Lead)--stay in front of the chairs.
- 1400-1700 putting out chairs (Matt G. Team Lead) 2-4 people.

Tuesday June 30

- Morning; Continue any of the above as needed.
- 1000 Case and Lamp pickup at ANA Warehouse (Frank T. Team Lead. Need eight people and four vehicles.
- 1130-1700 place cases, lamps, extension cords (Matt G. Team Lead) Four people. Also: Six people to unpack cases (Frank T. Team Lead),
- 1530-1700 Dealer Registration setup (Barbara T. Team Lead). Three people.
- 1600-1700 Final checks, Gig Line (Terry C. Team Lead) Two people needed.

Wednesday July 1

- 0830 Volunteers continue as necessary.
- 0900 Gig Line tables and chairs (Terry C. Team Lead)
- 0900 prepare show office and dealer registration (Lynn M. and Barbara T., Team Leads) Three people to help with registration.
- 1400 floor opens to dealers. Need 6-8 helpers (Robert C. Team Lead) to move dealers in.

Thursday July 2

• 0630-1800 need club table volunteers

Friday July 3

• 0630-1800 need club table volunteers

Saturday July 4

- 0900--1600. club table volunteers
- Morning: At least two people to start gathering cases, lamps, and extension cords as dealers leave, and start cleaning up (Cary R., Dale G., and Wayne W. Team Leads)

- Starting at noon: At least four more people to continue gathering cases, lamps, extension cords. Lynn is lead for gathering these items. Frank T. is lead for taking cases back to the ANA (six more people)
- 1600 Tables must be taken down, Floor swept. Eight people. Work gloves recommended.
- 1900 Cleanup should be complete.



Full Minutes of the Executive Leadership Committee Meeting, May 11, 2020.

At 6:30 PM on 5/11/2020 our Executive Leadership Committee was called to order. We discussed the following topics with the following resulting outcomes:

- Barbara T. provided a CC Financial Update [reproduced above—Ed.] for the month of April
- Ken B. and Barbara T. spoke about the new CC Financial Spreadsheet
 - We now have the capability to track and show to Club Members our expenditures and revenue, by month, back to 2017
 - Going forward we will continue to track all expenditures and revenue
 - The Excel spreadsheet will allow us to forecast a yearly budget based on an average of monthly expenditures and revenue
 - We will use this for the yearly Strategic Planning Meeting each November
- Coin Club Meeting on 26 May
 - Ken B. exchanged emails with Senior Officer Specialist Tiffany Allen at the Gold Hill Division Police Station concerning when the facility would be available for Club Meetings
 - The opening of the facility will most likely be based on when Colorado Springs Public Libraries open to the public
 - Currently this will not happen until 1 June or sometime after that
 - The decision will come from City and Police Force Leadership
 - Currently they are planning that Mask Wearing inside the building will be mandatory as the use of safe distancing practices
 - The Executive Leadership Committee unanimously voted on canceling the Coin Club's May 26TH meeting
 - In order to keep our members safe and comfortable while attending Club Meetings and when we do return to having Club Meetings the following practices, at a minimum, will be practiced:
 - All members and guest will wear face masks covering both the nose and mouth
 - There will be no refreshments or coffee bar
 - The only table will be for auction lots and member prizes
 - Members to the greatest extent possible will maintain a safe distance of 6 feet between each other (chairs will be placed in 6 foot grids in the room for seating during the meeting)
 - As a Club we will maintain these and other Federal, State, and Local directed "Safe Distancing"
 Practices until they are not required by those governing organizations
- Ken B. provided an update to the 2020 Colorado Springs Coin, Currency, and Collectibles Show:
 - He has met with the Event Center Staff, Security Company, Brady's (Tables and Chairs), Liability Insurance Company, the City of Colorado Springs Tax Office, and El Paso County Department of Health
 - As of now the show is still on
 - The folks at the El Paso County Department of Health will have the final say on whether we can hold the show or not
 - They will not make a final decision until at least two weeks out
 - If they say we can have it they can always reverse that decision based on the situation and if anything negative happens (this can be done even when the show as already started)
 - If they say we cannot have the show they will not reverse that decision
 - We will most likely have to have a continuous count of how many people enter and exit (they could put a limit on how many people are in the room at one time (we cannot fudge the numbers whatsoever Lynn, Holly, and Ann will be responsible for this at the public registration table))

- The folks at the Insurance Company are delaying putting the request in for a Certificate of Insurance (everything is ready they are waiting to see what El Paso County says two weeks out)
 - Once Ken pays for the insurance there is no getting that cost back whether the show happens or not
- The folks at the City Tax Office are doing the same for Ken concerning getting the Show's City Event License
 - This year he will not get an Auction License as he has already canceled it
- The show will be in Hall A and we will have the full use of Hall B for bringing dealers in and out (set-up and logistics will be very similar to last year with some improvements, especially in Security and Parking)
- Brady's will drop most of the Tables and Chairs by 8 AM Monday morning, 29 June to allow for a better set-up (they should all be clean and undamaged)
- We will have the same security company as last year with some new faces but several of the previous group
 - Security has been increased for Dealer Set-up and Dealer Move-out
 - We will have all dealers park their vehicles out in front of the Hall B Garage Door to facilitate providing better security
 - On Saturday (or if a dealer is leaving earlier in the show) we will have dealers park their cars in Hall B on the day they are moving-out
- Ken has made changes and updates to the 2020 Volunteer Hours and Functions (see attached word document)
 - He is still looking for a Club or Society Member to volunteer to be the lead for the Show Exhibits
- Show-Special Club Newsletter:
 - The Executive Committee voted on not publishing a Show-Special Newsletter
 - The Club and Numismatic Society will receive free advertising in the Show Program that Ken B. has printed
- The Newsletter's Name
 - We will be holding a "Name the Club's Newsletter" contest for all Club Members to participate in
 - Club Members can submit potential names to Steve D., Holly S., and Ken B.
 - When we hold our next Club Meeting (hopefully in June) we will have a club vote to pick the Name for our Club Newsletter
 - The Member that suggested the Winning Name will receive a Prize
- Advertising in the Coin Club Newsletter:
 - The Executive Leadership Committee voted unanimously to allow Dealers, Organization, Events, and other appropriate agencies to advertise in our Club's Newsletter
 - Those entities that would like to advertise in our Newsletter will have to provide a "Print-Ready" copy of want they want to go into the Newsletter
 - Costs for advertising will be:
 - \$12 per year for a Business Card size advertisement
 - Entities will have to pay for a full-year to advertise using their business card
 - \$30 for a quarter- page ad for six months
 - If they chose to advertise for a year it will cost \$55
 - \$60 for a half-page ad for six months
 - If they chose to advertise for a year it will cost \$110
 - \$150 for a full-page ad for six months
 - If they chose to advertise for a year it will cost \$275
 - There will be no Newsletter Advertising discounts for Club Members
 - The Executive Leadership Committee thought that this could bring additional revenue to the Club without creating a lot of extra work

- They also thought that it would be good to offer some sort of incentive to advertise for longer periods of time
- Entities would be able to change or modify they ads to keep their current and up-to-date as long as what they provide is "print-ready"
- Inputs for the Coin Club Newsletter were discussed:
 - Steve D. needs to receive them as soon as possible so the Newsletter could go out to Membership by 20 May
- Ken B., Kevin, and Holly provided an update on what is happening with the ANA
 - The deadline to submit responses for the ANA Trivia Challenge was extended an additional 30-days
 - Due to the COVID-19 situation four individuals working at the ANA were furloughed
 - Those remaining are picking up those individuals responsibilities
 - Ken B. was asked to be and was unanimously approved to be the Colorado District Representative for the ANA
 - He will start going to other Club and Society Meetings throughout the State and Region
 - He is hoping that he will be able to bring back a lot of ideas that our Club can emulate to make us even better and our meetings even more interesting
 - The ANA Money Museum will remain closed for the foreseeable future
 - ANA Leadership and Staff are still working from their homes
- Year-End Prizes:
 - We will recognize those Members who volunteer to help with events and Club activities
 - For each event or activity they assist with (also for each four hours of continuous CSCCCS show volunteer work) they will be awarded a "volunteer ticket"
 - Elected Club Officers do not get a ticket for performing the duties of the office they were
 voted into but are still eligible to qualify for tickets through the same activities that Club
 Members do
 - These tickets will be placed in a "hat" at the Annual Christmas Party and Names will be drawn to receive prizes
 - Our hopes are that we will be able to have a significant "Grand-Prize"
 - We are hoping this will incentivize more Members to get directly involved with Club Activities and Events
- The Club has 84 Members:
 - We have 51 Members who have paid their 2020 dues
 - 31 Members who have not paid their 2020 dues
 - We received in the mail Membership Dues from two individuals
 - One is a current Club Member
 - One is a brand new Member!
 - 2 Members who are Honoree members because how much they do on a continuing basis for the Club

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 PM
