My little corner of this was manning the Indian Head Cents table, and I took most of the pictures from that vantage point. (The last picture was taken by someone else, so you can see the IHC table at far right.)

I brought in the four Indian Head Cents in my type set, plus the Flying Eagle Cent. (Generally, people who specialize in IHCs also do the Flying Eagle cents because there were only two regular-issue years of the Flying Eagle cent, plus the rare 1856 date which is essentially a pattern. The ANA didn't focus on this, but I made sure to mention it.) The ANA provided a giveaway IHC, plus photos of proofs from the museum, and also a set of the 2009 series of Lincoln Cents commemorating his life.

Other tables also had ANA giveaways. The YNs left with plenty of loot, and many will hopefully use the items as starters for new collections.
