 - Steve D. 1841 Liberty Half Eagle No Motto AU58+
 - Holly S. Armed Forces Silver medal
 - Doug L. Trade dollars AU53 & AU58. 1875-CC is his favorite.
 - Chris L. Talked about the US Mint enrollment program for gold and Morgans.
 - Dave T. Brought in his set of Franklin half dollars.
 - George M. Showed 5 Lincoln cents encased in a collar from the late 1930's/1940's making them the size of a quarter.
 - Tom W. 1890-CC Morgan dollar
 - Dennis H. 1864 \$5 Confederate note. This is what was found in Abraham Lincolns pocket when he died. Also had obsolete currency from 1860 which is only printed on the front.
 - Matt D. Secured \$1,600 of new 2021-D Franklin Halves and offered them to membership at face value.

Coin Roll Search Cent, nickel, dime and quarter rolls were offered to membership at face value for searching. Notable finds:

- Steve D. found a 1942 nickel (unfortunately not a 1942-P silver) and a Bahamas quarter.
