

**2023 National Money Show** March 2-4 Phoenix Convention Center, Phoenix AZ.




**2024 National Money Show** March 14-16 Broadmoor Resort, Colorado Springs CO.

This is an 1826 politina (half ruble). It was slightly smaller than a half dollar. The Russians were already striking coins in collar (we were not doing so yet). This was a short-lived type; this "wings down" eagle was only used on silver from 1826-1830 though on copper it ran the entire decade of the 1830s. The obverse inscription gives the denomination and year, the reverse translates to "Of pure silver, 2 zolotniks,  $10^{-1/2}$  dolei" and the St. Petersburg mintmark

2 zolotniks,  $10 \frac{1}{2}$  dolei is a weight expressed in traditional Russian units and is almost exactly equal to 9 grams
