

FEBRUARY 2025 MEETING

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 18 AT 6:30PM. DOORS OPEN AT 6PM.

This meeting will feature a talk by Bob Shippee.

Shippee began collecting in childhood, searching his paper route earnings for rare Lincoln cents, Buffalo nickels and Mercury dimes. He then was given his family's collection, dating back to his great grandfather who was active in the 1870s, including an almost complete run of cents from 1795-1909. He graduated from Brown University with a degree in economics, and worked as an international banker for 36 years. He built and sold an impressive type collection and leveraged his experiences to become a respected author with *Pleasure and Profit: 100 Lessons for Building and Selling a Collection of Rare Coins*, which won the 2015 Numismatic Literary Guild Award for "Best Investment Book." He has also taught at the ANA Summer Seminar. He has now branched out into US Pattern Coins, colonials, territorial gold pieces, US and European medals, and ancient Greek silver coins.

- Auction. Bring your items to sell! Proceeds can go to you or be donated to the Club.


