#### **GLEANINGS** March 2017

The expression of Liberty is a critical aspect of US coinage. The statute that authorizes the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins requires the word "Liberty" or a design symbolic of Liberty on every coin. For many years a female image representing Liberty was the obverse device. This year for the first time that image is a young African American woman.

The coin is the 2017 American Liberty 225<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gold Coin (1 oz. .9999 fine 24-karat gold, West Point Mint, high relief with a proof finish). This is a response to the recommendation of the 2 federal panels that advise Treasury on coinage: Citizens Coin Advisory Committee and Commission of Fine Arts. Their goal is for our coinage to reflect the diversity of our population. Other images to reflect our nation's cultural and ethnic diversity will follow biennially.

Lady Liberty faces left with a crown of stars similar to the crown worn by the Statue of Freedom on the top of the U.S. Capitol building. The inscriptions LIBERTY, 1792, 2017, and IN GOD WE TRUST complete the obverse. The reverse device is an eagle in flight facing right. There is also an edge inscription "225<sup>th</sup> Anniversary" and 13 5-point stars.

The design was unveiled January 12, 2017 and orders can be placed beginning April 6, 2017. The price has not been set.

- 1.) George M. (Canadian Cents) a set of the 1858-1920 Canadian Large Cents from the three series of Victoria 1858 to 1901, Edward VII 1902 to 1910, George V 1911 to 1920
- 2.) Terry Ca. (Peace Dollars) telling of the coin designed by Anthony de Francisci, being the result of a competition to find designs emblematic of peace. Showing a medal struck by Dan Carr, (1964-D Peace Silver fantasy issue)
- 3.) Dan U. (Lincoln) acknowledging Lincoln's birthday with related items; telling of landmarks named after him, pilgrimage patches, tokens, medals and the values of the cents
- 4.) Ken H. (Counterfeit Gold) displaying a set of counterfeit French gold Francs, telling of analysis methods of coins and alloys while determining weight
- 5. Kevin L. (Odd Uses for Money) showing and telling some of the most unusual uses for the items that we use daily, known as coins
- 6. Steve D. (Periodic Table) reviewing to the membership the precious metals of the chemical elements. Also, telling of the rows of the table being periods; the columns, groups
