- 1.) J.C.S. (Digital Microscope) showing a battery powered LED microscope that showed digital images he had purchased for under \$90.00
- 2.) Gerome W. (Nebraska Exposition) displaying a gilded and silver Exposition Souvenir Coins from the 1898 exposition, Treasury Exhibit in the Government Building
- 3.) George M. (The Face on the Barroom Floor) displaying the famous Teller House's token and the 1936 poem that went along with the illustrators painting of his lovers face on the floor
- 4.) Dan U. (Poland Millennium Medal) 1966 three inch Bronze Commemorative Medal commemorating 1,000 years of polish coinage
- 5.) Terry C. (MPC) displaying and telling history of MPC (Military Payment Certificates), and the note of "*Defenders of Democracy*" which circulated as paper money in military installations around the world from 1946 into the 1973

### GLEANINGS May 2018

Another Blast from the Past, this from the May 1998 newsletter twenty years ago, that may be familiar to those who belonged to the society then and interesting to the rest of us.

For the MAY (1998) PROGRAM Bill Kannenberg, a society member, would give a talk entitled "Franklin Series Half Dollars" and discuss some history of the early American inventor and ambassador who appears on the coins named after him.

The 1 page newsletter contains a reminder of the Colorado Springs Coin Show that was to be held July 10, 11 & 12, 1998 at the City Auditorium and a notice of the Olympic Sports Memorabilia and Coin Show on June 26 - 28 at the US Olympic Training Center.

The June 1998 newsletter tells us that there were 14 members at the May meeting and 4 exhibit talks: Andy B. "1 coin type, mint, year set" the 1889 Prince Edward Island cent struck in Heaton, Canada; Steve D. "Paul's 5 Year reign" Russian Ruble with monograms, kopeck, and large re-stamped coin; John B. "Mother's Day piece" 1979 Israel 50 lira coin depicting a mother with children; William S. "Queen Victoria" tokens, coins and medals showing the different portraits of the Queen. The winning exhibit was "Queen Victoria."
