MINUTES OF THE MONTHLY MEETING OF THE COLORADO SPRINGS NUMISMATIC SOCIETY SUNDAY, MAY 12, 2019

George M, President, called the meeting to order. The April Minutes and Secretary's Report, as contained in the April newsletter, were approved. The Treasurer's report was given and approved.

Attendance: 24 members. No guests were in attendance.

OLD BUSINESS: Bob C. gave an update on the 2019 Colorado Springs Coin Currency and Collectibles Show and volunteer signups. Dan U gave an update on the Raffle for the show.

NEW BUSINESS: No new business

No other business was discussed.

EXHIBIT TALKS: Summary of the 6 exhibit talks:

- Not numbered- Ken H Thomas Uram, who is running for ANA Vice-President, produced poker chip campaign tokens and gave some to Ken to distribute to the Society. ANA members had first priority in receiving a chip. Ken also brought coins from his recent trip to China and everyone was invited to take one. Ken also reported on the recent robbery of the Hallenbeck Coin Gallery.
 - 1. George M George presented a timeline that he produced years ago of the ante-bellum coinage of the U.S. covering 1843 1876.
 - 2. Dan U Dan exhibited a post WW1 German political token focused on French use of African colonial troops for the occupation of the Rhineland pursuant to the Treaty of Versailles. The purpose of the token was to provoke resentment of the Treaty and the occupying forces. It was also


used as emergency money, like hard times tokens, during a period of hyperinflation in Germany. A German 10,000,000 Marks note dated 1923 and 5 Mark coins from 1935 and 1936 were included.

3. Bob C – In honor of the upcoming presentation by John Dean at the May Colorado Springs Coin Club meeting, Bob presented an 1887-CC GSA

Silver Dollar and an introduction to and history of the GSA silver dollars.

- 4. Milt N. Milt displayed a coin from the co-regency of Constantine VI and his mother Empress Irene (780 – 797 A.D.). Their reign was marked by turmoil and rivalry, including reversal of the iconoclast policy (the controversy over the veneration of icons in the church), and the brief exile of Irene. Eventually Irene deposed her son and had him blinded. She then ruled alone until 802.
- 5. Steve D Steve displayed coins and paper money from his recent trip to Indonesia to see Komoto Dragons, including photos of dragons he saw on his trip.
