MINUTES OF THE MONTHLY MEETING OF THE COLORADO SPRINGS NUMISMATIC SOCIETY SUNDAY, AUGUST 11, 2019

George M, President, called the meeting to order.

Attendance: 34 members and one non-member were present.

The July Minutes and Secretary's Report, as contained in the August newsletter, were approved. The Treasurer's report was given and approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

NEW BUSINESS: Tom Hallenbeck was recently awarded the ANA Zerbe Award, which is the highest award bestowed by the ANA. Tom will be honored at the October CSCC meeting where he will be the speaker.

Eric T. and Phil submitted membership applications, which were unanimously approved. [GEORGE DOUBLE CHECK ME ON THIS- THANKS]

EXHIBIT TALKS: Summary of the 8 exhibit talks:

- 1. Bob C Commemorative coin honoring the U.S.S. Olympia, a Cruiser that served as the flagship of Commodore Dewey at the Battle of Manila Bay during the Spanish-American War. Bob discussed the history of the Spanish-American War (1895 1898), including the independence of Cuba, the end of Spanish rule in the Caribbean and Pacific, and making the US a world power. The Olympia is the only ship from the Spanish American War still in existence. It is part of the Independence Seaport Museum in Philadelphia, PA. Melted propellers from the ship provided the metal to make the medal, which includes an image of the ship and the instructions from Comm. Dewey at the beginning of the Battle of Manila Bay to the Captain of the Olympia, Capt. Gridley, "You may fire when you are ready Gridley."
- 2. George M <u>United States Coins and Currency 1939</u> published in1938. This is an example of numismatic books published 7 years before the Redbook came along. The layout of the book and values contained in it provide a contrast with modern books like the Redbook. For instance, for each denomination the coins of each mint are listed separately. Also, the three-dollar value for an Uncirculated 1909 S VDB elicited groans from many of those present.
- 3. Kevin <u>Dead Sea Commemorative</u> Sterling silver proof-like 1 shekel coin from the Bank of Israel with legends in Hebrew, Arabic and English. An image of the Dead Sea and an ibex are on the coin. Kevin also shared information about the Dead Sea and his trip to Israel last year.
- 4. Steve D <u>U.S. 15¢ and 50¢ "fractionals".</u> Steve displayed 15 cent and 50 cent paper currency as specimens of the small paper notes issued by the U.S. government in five separate issues, 1862 1876. The fractionals were printed because coins were being hoarded and disappeared from


circulation during the uncertain times of the Civil War. They are called fractionals because they were issued in fractions of a dollar, from 3 cents to 50 cents.

5. Dan U – <u>Charles Bridge</u>, <u>Prague</u>, <u>Czechoslovakia</u>. Dan shared some of the history of Holy Roman Emperor Charles IV and the Charles Bridge in Prague that was built in 1357 at the direction of Charles IV. The year, month, day, hour and minute of the laying of the cornerstone creates a palindrome 135797531 [1357 – 9 – 7 – 5:31 AM]. The Charles Bridge appears on the small denomination coins of Czechoslovakia, 3, 5 and 10 haleru from 1922 to 1938. Charles IV appears on the current Czech 100 Koruna note. The 3, 5, and 10 haleru coins, 100 Koruna note, 1948 Czech Charles University commemorative, and photos of the bridge were included in the display.

Three exhibits with the exact same vote tally tied for August 2019 exhibit winner. Those were Bob, Kevin, and Dan. Bob and Dan agreed that the YN, Kevin, should receive the August Award Certificate.
