MINUTES of the May 8, 2021 Meeting of the COLORADO SPRINGS NUMISMATIC SOCIETY

The meeting was held at Hilltop Baptist Church and called to order by President George M. with 10 members and 0 guest present.

Secretary's Report: Secretary's Report, which consists of the Minutes of the April 2021 meeting contained in the May 2021 newsletter were approved without discussion.

Treasurer's report: Treasurer's report was presented and approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

Steve D. reported that the ANA selected the Broadmoor, Colorado Springs as the site of the 2022 National Money Show, scheduled for March 10-12, 2022. The CSNS and CSCC will be the host clubs.

NEW BUSINESS:

Payment of \$50 to Hilltop Baptist Church for the use of the meeting room was approved. Kevin L reported on the Denver Coin Show that he attended yesterday, Saturday.The Colorado Springs Coin Club will host the Pikes Peak Coin Show on Saturday, October 16, 2021. This is a 1 day show to be held at the Fraternal Order of Eagles, 1050 South 21st St, Colorado Springs [near US Hwy 24] where the CSCC is currently meeting. More details are in process and will be discussed at our meeting,

EXHIBITS:

George M. showed a Standing Liberty quarter with an S mintmark and a date worn away by circulation. Even though the date cannot be read (or barely recognized with proper lighting) the date can be ascertained by the lack of stars below the eagle on the reverse, making it a 1917-S Type 1.

Dan U shared 2 NRA challenge coins that he received from Col. Steve Ellsworth in 2012 for assisting with the numismatic security course taught by Col. Ellsworth. The challenge coins were shared to represent the value of the people in the hobby that friendships we acquire in addition to the numismatic acquisitions.

Kevin L displayed the SS Andrea Doris collection he obtained at yesterday's coin show. It consists of a 1000 Lira note from the Bank of Italy, with obvious damage, that was salvaged from the ship's safe. It is now encased in Lucite with a certificate of authenticity. A pamphlet and video on the ship and recovery came with the note. The Italian ocean liner Andrea Doria sunk the night of July 25, 1956 after colliding with the SS Stockholm. Paper money from shipwrecks are rare. The 1981 salvage operation found silver certificates and Italian notes.

Steve D used a computer card (these fed data into computers before floppy disks for those of you not old enough to remember) and 1901 series \$10 "Bison" large legal tender note he recently acquired to explain the connection between US large notes, computer cards and even airline boarding passes. The computer cards used the same dimensions (7.5" x 3.125") as large notes in order to utilize existing equipment made to process large notes.
