MINUTES of the January 9, 2022 Meeting of the COLORADO SPRINGS NUMISMATIC SOCIETY

The meeting was held at Hilltop Baptist Church and called to order by President George M. with 10 members and 0 guests present.

Secretary's Report: Secretary's Report, which consists of the Minutes of the November 2021 meeting contained in the January 2022 newsletter was approved without discussion or modification.

Treasurer's report: Treasurer's report was presented and approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

National Money Show – Steve D reported on his visits to Colorado coin clubs, as far north as Fort Collins, to recruit ambassador volunteers. He also listed those who volunteered to lead various aspects of the show.

George M. brought up the need for a replacement club Secretary by March when Dan U. moves away and the importance of the position. It was remembered that a couple of years ago the CS Coin Club took a few months to fill the Secretary's role by dividing the responsibilities. Dan will assist with the transition for anyone interested in giving back to their hobby and the society in this way.

Wayne W., Barbara T. and Dan U. will coordinate adding new Raffle Games managers.

2022 Dues – CSNS will began collecting 2022 dues are due. Dues are \$10 for Individuals, \$5 for YNs (Young Numismatists are those under 18), and \$20 for a Family (all adults and children in the immediate family).

EXHIBITS:

1. George M. brought a booklet entitled <u>Counterstamped Stone Mountain Half Dollars:</u> <u>Where Are They Now?</u> that was written and published by Adna Wilde c. 1987. Adna was an active member and officer of this society. He also provided leadership in the American Numismatic Society, was elected to the ANA Numismatic Hall of Fame in 2002 (his plaque with photo is on the wall near the entrance to the ANA) and was named ANA Numismatist of the year in 2005. - 2. Bob C. shared his knowledge of and passion for Meteorite Coins, which he has collected since July 2009. They tend to be non-circulating legal tender coins that contain a small piece of a meteorite embedded in the coin. His display included a 2014 Niue \$1 NZ dollar coin struck in Poland for the island nation, a postcard of the Canyon Diablo crater in Arizona, Great Meteor Crater patch and a Canyon Diablo meteor specimen. For Bob this specialty is the perfect connection to science through numismatics.
- Although Milt N. doesn't usually collect error and variety coins he exhibited his 1938 D/ D Buffalo Nickel with clear doubling of the mint mark and attractive toning on the obverse.
- 4. Steve D. showed his 1797 U.S. dollar with small eagle reverse from his U.S. coin type set extension. It is graded XF40, 9x7 Large Letters, series 49 in a PCGS holder. A remarkable coin for being two and a quatrer centuries old.
