## MINUTES of the May 8, 2022 Meeting of the COLORADO SPRINGS NUMISMATIC SOCIETY

The meeting was held at the Gold Hill Police Station Community Room and called to order by President George M. with 14 members and 2 guests (Debbie G. & Matt).

Secretary's Report: Secretary's Report, which consists of the Minutes of the April 2022 meeting contained in the May 2022 newsletter was approved without discussion or modification.

Treasurer's report: The Treasurer, unable to attend the meeting, had given the Secretary the information to report to the club. That report was read, accepted and approved.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

**2022 Dues** – CSNS will continue collecting 2022 dues that are due. Dues are \$10 for Individuals, \$5 for YNs (Young Numismatists are those under 18), and \$20 for a Family (all adults and children in the immediate family). Secretary reported that there was one remaining expense from the 2021 Christmas Party and that was the food. That expense was the total of \$192.85 (split between the 2 clubs), CSNS's share was \$96.43 to be paid to CSCC.....There was also, the proceeds from books sold on e-bay in the amount of \$426.89 of which CSNS will receive from CSCC, the amount of \$213.44. The Treasurer was not in attendance so these transactions were not completed.

EXHIBITS

- Bob C. gave a presentation on the Canadian 13 coin Confederation 125th Anniversary set. These coins were struck by the Royal Canadian Mint in celebration of Canada's 125th Anniversary of Confederation. The set is comprised of 12 quarters with scenes from each province and territory in Canada and a parliament \$1 coin...all in proof like condition and spread out across a colorful map of Canada. The \$1 coin shows the Parliament Building. He also spoke about the Nova Scotia lighthouse (Peggys' Point) there at Peggy's Cove.This lighthouse was built in 1915 and continued in use until it closed in 2009.
- Larry F. shared with our members some of his "Disney Collectibles". This time he displayed Walt Disney Co. Common stock certificates that he recently obtained in the denominations of .50 cent, \$1.00, \$5.00, & \$10. He also had a binder containing Disney \$5.00 certificates. He purchases these certificates from dealers and e-bay. He also has a Professional Catalog / Vacation Guide for Disney Fantasy Currency. One share of Disney common stock on the website in 2002 was about \$100.00 a share. He mentioned, too, that the .50 was harder to get.
- 3. Steve. I., in his presentation, continued the theme of early US gold coinage. He spoke of the 1813 1834 type, which he does not have, then told the story of how the government was forced to adjust the gold content downward due to a change in the market gold/silver value ratio. This happened in mid -1834. To mark the change and stop its coins from being exported and melted), the US came out with the Classic Head gold coinage, but as before only in the \$2 ½ and \$5 values (\$10 gold pieces had last been made in 1804). He showed an 1836 \$2 ½ or quarter eagle of this newer, lighter-weight type.
