# MINUTES of the July 10, 2022 Meeting of the COLORADO SPRINGS NUMISMATIC SOCIETY

The meeting was held at the Gold Hill Police Station Community Room and called to order by President George M. with 18 members in attendance.

Secretary's Report: Secretary's Report, which consists of the Minutes of the June 2022 meeting contained in the July 2022 newsletter was approved without discussion or modification.

Treasurer's report was presented and approved.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**2022 Dues** – CSNS will continue collecting 2022 dues that are due. Dues are \$10 for Individuals, \$5 for YNs (Young Numismatists are those under 18), and \$20 for a Family (all adults and children in the immediate family). ### **NEW BUSINESS**

CSCC did have "Youth Night" on July 26<sup>th</sup>, which would be their regular meeting date & time. Members from both clubs were encouraged to come & help out or just be there for support of the event.

George ( President ) presented his bill for quarterly expenses (April/May/June). These expenses consisted of door prizes, Kids Treasure Chest for CoinXWest Show, copying, etc. Total expenses came to \$213.00 which were approved by members. The President also thanked members who donated items to the "Kids Treasure Chest" and sat at the CSNS club table during the CoinXWest show.

- 1. George M. gave an interesting talk about the "Glory Hole", a mining operation in the area of Central City Colorado. The book he showed "How the Glory Hole" was made....originally, it was called "The Patch". The mine itself was at the base of an extinct volcano.
- 2. Larry F. had a presentation of the "Ford Centennial Commemorative Medallions 100 years of Ford Motor Company". The 1st car was a 1903 Model A....following it were 14 other models that Ford came out with. Each medallion came in a folder that explains the car & gives information on it. These medallions were made by Northwest Territories Mint. It went out of business in disgrace; however, they continued in medallic art.
- 3. Bob C. gave a presentation about "Romulus & Remus" & the city of Rome. In Roman mythology, Romulus & Remus (twin brothers) whose story tells of events that led to the founding of the city of Rome. The image of a she-wolf suckling the twins in their infancy has been a symbol of the city of Rome & the Roman Kingdom by Romulus....following the death of Remus. Rhea Silvia gave birth to Romulus & Remus whose father was thought to be Mars....the god of War. Bob's presentation included a commemorative helmeted bust of Roma. In the August issue of the Numismatist...there is an article about Romulus & Remus.
- 4. Ken H. Exhibited a plaque "Continental Airlines/United. This airline flew to many different states.....including Az,.Ks., Co., Tx., Hi., Fl, & Micronesia. He also had a copy of a \$20.00 bill which was stamped with "Motion Picture Use" At first glance, it would pass for a real \$20.00 bill.
- 5. Milt N. brought 2 books to show to members. One was "Colorado Territorial Script" The 2nd one was "A Pioneer Denver Mint" by N. Mumey.
- 6. Steve showed pictures of the 1814 classic head large cent he's had in his type set. Classic head cents ran from 1808 1814 and are much harder to obtain than most other types of large cents. This was the lowest grade coin in the entire set (VF-35), so he has been trying to upgrade it for years. He finally succeeded and so he brought in the new coin, also an 1814 but now in AU50, along with the pictures he took of it.
